EMBRACING THE FUTURE
Reflect - Respond

The Asia Pacific Student Services Association/APSSA conference

Students today maintain multiple identities. They learn, interact and connect with each other, as well as with the world around them, not just through face-to-face encounters, but also through the screens on their mobile phones. As a result, their knowledge structures, belief systems, and how they respond to the environment are also shaped by their interactions, both online and offline.

The 16th APSSA International Conference 2018 highlights pertinent issues for discussion in the student track of the conference. It is argued that partners have to look back at their own experience (reflect), identify ways to reach out and act (respond) and look at their roles and responsibilities in a different light (reflect). It is hoped that the conference would enable participants to share experiences, contrast-specific lectures, and best practices in which could be implemented at their institutions post-conference. They would then be able to work effectively with student affairs professionals for the benefit of the greater student population.

SUBTHEMES

Four subthemes have been identified for the student conference of the 16th APSSA International Conference 2018.

51. HUMANISATION

- Using Social Media Responsibly

This subtheme deals with the students' role in ensuring ethical, responsible, and ethical use of social media. Discussions under this subtheme include, but not limited to, usage patterns and demographics; case studies and lessons learnt in the use of social media, responsibility in sharing accurate and verified information sources, as well as in organising successful campaigns on social media.

52. PHYSICAL AND MENTAL WELLNESS

- Challenges and Opportunities

This subtheme promotes the students to look at how they manage themselves, their relations with their peers and others around them, and individuals, but not limited to, students' interpersonal competencies, students' social safety net, ways to be insightful to student affairs professionals with regard to physical and mental well-being, as well as peer support and network in ensuring good physical and mental wellness.

53. YOUTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT

This subtheme underscores the students' role in enhancing their environmental perspectives and intercultural competencies. Discussions under this subtheme include, but not limited to, their understanding towards current social, economic, political and environmental challenges around the world, integration between domestic and international students, participation in students' mobility programmes, as well as national tally and international standards in environmental sustainability.

54. BECOMING AN ENLIGHTENED GLOBAL CITIZEN

This subtheme encourages the students to deliberate on issues related to environmental sustainability. Discussions under this subtheme include, but not limited to, education for sustainable development (ESD), disaster management, and disaster risk reduction on sustainability organised by student societies, as well as short-term studies related to environmental sustainability.

ENGAGE - EMPOWER - EVOLVE

Pushing the frontiers of Student Affairs

Students are at the heart and soul of student affairs professionalism. The diverse student body demands passion, diligence and strong commitment from these professionals in their day-to-day operations. They are the unsung heroes behind student success, providing the bear of passion and assistance to the student population.

The 16th APSSA International Conference 2018 highlights higher education in significant and profound ways. As a result, issues and challenges faced by student affairs professionals may be different from those experienced years ago. Amidst increased expectations, evergreen funding and greater interdependency among stakeholders, these professionals need to swiftly adapt to change and deliver. Through international networks such as the Asia Pacific Student Services Association (APSSA), the student affairs professionals are able to build connections and communicate with one another, enabling them to be better engaged in current developments related to their core work, subsequently supporting their personal and professional development (evolve). At the end of this conference, innovative approaches and room for improvement for the benefit of students under their care.

SUBTHEMES

Five subthemes have been identified for the staff conference of the 16th APSSA International Conference 2018. The five subthemes are as follows:

C1. EDUCABILITY

- Engaging and Empowering for Future Careers

This subtheme focuses on the role of student affairs professionals in supporting students' career development. Discussions under this subtheme include, but not limited to, academic employability, industry engagement, careerservices, entrepreneurial ventures, internships and vocational trainings, as well as innovative models to prepare students for their future careers.

C2. STUDENT DEVELOPMENT

- Building Disruptive Leaders through Student Development Programmes

This subtheme discusses on student development through a strategic approach, with the ultimate objective of nurturing students who serve and lead with a purpose towards their peers and communities. Discussions under this subtheme include, but not limited to, strategies in student development, high impact student development activities, alignment of student development initiatives to national and regional agendas, as well as recent trends in student development.

C3. WELLNESS AND MENTAL HEALTH

- Current Challenges, Future Opportunities

This subtheme concentrates on the role of student affairs professionals in monitoring and supporting students' mental well-being. Discussions under this subtheme include, but not limited to, student counselling, mental healthcare services, mechanisms and operating procedures in managing student mental well-being, as well as peer structures, pastoral care, religious guidance and other forms of support for students in need.

C4. STUDENT RESPONSE

- Reinventing Sustainable Sustains Models

This subtheme looks at the provision of both on- and off-campus student residence and its management. Discussion under this subtheme include, but not limited to, funding models, property development, maintenance, options for renewing Generation Z as well as future trends in student residence development among property developers and private operators.
